1 **WHEREAS**, the County of Rock is eligible to apply for funds from the State Criminal Alien Assistance
2 Program (SCAAP); and,

4 **WHEREAS**, the Office of Justice Programs of the U.S. Department of Justice makes payments to eligible
5 States and units of local government that incur certain types of costs due to incarceration of undocumented
6 criminal aliens; and,

8 **WHEREAS**, a State or unit of local government that receives a payment under the FY 2017 program
9 must use the payment only for correctional purposes; and,

11 **WHEREAS**, the SCAAP online application may be completed and submitted only by an appropriate
12 official of the applicant government.

14 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Rock County Board of Supervisors duly assembled
15 this 12th day of April, 2018, does hereby approve and authorize the submission of the State
16 Criminal Alien Assistance Program application, and the Chair of the Rock County Board of Supervisors
17 is hereby authorized to sign all necessary documents on behalf of the County of Rock; and,

19 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED**, that the Chair of the Rock County Board of Supervisors may grant legal
20 authority to a designated submitting government official to apply for the 2017 State Criminal Alien
21 Assistance Program on behalf of the County of Rock.





Executive Summary

The County of Rock is eligible to apply for funds from the State Criminal Alien Assistance Program (SCAAP).

Under the State Criminal Alien Assistance Program, the Office of Justice Programs of the U.S. Department of Justice makes payments to eligible States and units of local government that incur certain types of costs due to incarceration of undocumented criminal aliens during a particular twelve-month reporting period.

As a matter of federal law, a State or unit of local government that receives a payment under the FY 2017 program must use the payment only for correctional purposes.

The SCAAP online application may be completed and submitted only by an appropriate official of the applicant government. For each applicant government, there may be only one submitting government official. That submitting government official must have the legal authority to apply to the FY 2017 program on behalf of the applicant government, must have the necessary knowledge and information to complete the entire application accurately, and must in fact complete and submit all sections of the application. Due diligence is required.

The Sheriff's Office normally applies for the SCAAP grant in fall of the named grant year. The 2017 grant application was not made available until February 2018.
