

Goals & Benefits

- To break the cycle of drug &/or alcohol use and crime.
- To reduce criminal justice costs by reducing drug addiction & street crime.
- To reduce incarceration for participants who present a low risk to public safety.
- To provide a fully integrated & comprehensive treatment program.
- To enhance personal, academic, & employment abilities among participants.

Eligibility Criteria

- An established resident of Rock Co.
- Not subject to jurisdiction of juvenile court & must be at least 18
- Offense is non-violent & results from a crime motivated by substance abuse/addiction/dependency
- No prior violent felony convictions-WI 941.291(1)(b)
- No convictions for violent misdemeanor offenses w/in last 3 years
- No indication of presence of a weapon during the commission of the present offense
- No prior convictions involving use of dangerous weapon
- No prior/current sex offenses, stalking, arson or kidnapping offenses
- No domestic assault convictions unless allowed by Team due to age circumstances
- Meets intensive- outpatient treatment criteria
- Participant must voluntarily agree to abide by all Program rules including possible future modifications which will be communicated before implementation
- Willingness to address issues of addiction
- Ability to physically participate in treatment
- Meets criteria of medium-high/high risk on a validated criminogenic risk assessment

Rock County Drug Court

A Treatment Diversion Program

A collaborative effort between the Rock County Courts, Rock County Sheriff's Office, Rock County District Attorney's Office, State Public Defender's Office, County Administration, and the WI Department of Corrections.

Program Overview

Upon entrance to the program each participant will receive an individualized criminogenic risk-need assessment and full biopsychosocial assessment to determine areas of strengths and needs. Based on these assessments, the individual will be required to participate in treatment groups as recommended by the Treatment Team.

Each participant will receive intensive Case Management to monitor and support the individual in the community. Participants are required to report to the Drug Court office on a regular basis and submit to random drug tests. Clients are required to appear weekly before Judge Barbara McCrory for a review of their treatment progress.

Fees

A payment of \$100.00 is required at the initial intake session. Payment of \$10.00 per week is required thereafter until program participation is completed.

*Fees are waived for DOC referrals.



Program Details

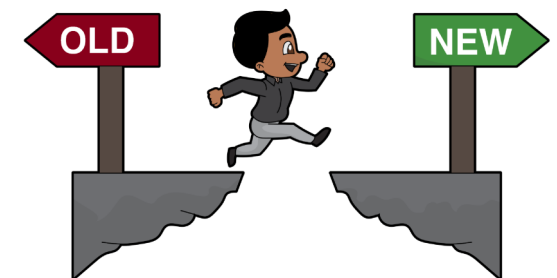
MORAL RECONATION THERAPY (MRT)

Instruction designed to restructure participant's thinking patterns. The goal is to discover the pattern of thinking that leads to inappropriate behavior, and develop alternative reactions that will bring more desirable results.

AODA Education

Course designed to enable the participant to achieve lasting abstinence from substance abuse. Participants learn the necessary skills to function independently in the community while managing their recovery from addiction.

- **Individual Counseling**
 - **Trauma Services**
- **Education/Employment**
 - **Housing Assistance**
 - **Specialized Needs**
- **Other Groups as Needed (DBT, Anger Management, Relapse Prevention, etc.)**



The Rock County Drug Court Program began in 2007 after Rock County applied for and received a Treatment Alternatives and Diversion (TAD) grant. Drug Court Case Managers oversee the fourteen month treatment program for those participating in the Rock County Drug Court. Treatment is designed for non-violent participants with substance abuse issues.

Entry into the Program requires a Drug Court contract agreement between the Rock County District Attorney's Office, Defense Counsel, and the participant. Entry also requires a plea of guilty or no contest to current charges in exchange for potential reduction or dismissal of those charges or other sentencing concessions made upon successful completion of the Program. Participants may also enter the program through a referral from the Department of Corrections.

To be eligible for Drug Court the participant must be a Rock County resident. Violent felony offenders or those convicted of a violent misdemeanor offense within the last three years are not eligible.
