Too Sick for School?

Knowing when to keep your kids home from school when they're sick is tricky business. Do you keep them home when they have a runny nose or a slight cough? How about when they complain about just "not feeling well"? There are some important things to consider when keeping your children home from school or day care.

If your child has cold-like symptoms, such as nasal drainage, sneezing, fatigue and a sore throat, the deciding factor on whether to send them off on the morning school bus is if they have a fever. No fever? Given your child feels pretty healthy otherwise, it's okay to head to school. Remember, however, that if you have any doubts or aren't sure, the best thing you can do is see your child's doctor and/or call him or her for advice.

If your child is running a fever, it may mean that your child has the flu. The presence of a fever is usually a good sign to keep your child home from school. A fever is a common symptom of viral infections, such as influenza. While at home, be sure he or she drinks plenty of fluids and rests. Typically, a child should be fever-free for 24 hours before returning to school.

Does your child have a bad cough and cold symptoms? This would be a good time to keep him/her home from school to see the doctor. A cough could indicate your child has the flu, a severe cold, bronchitis, or pneumonia. When the cough improves, however, it's time to head back to school. Make sure you don't wait until the cough completely goes away as this could take a couple of days or even a week!

If your child has diarrhea or is vomiting, it's important to keep them home from school until they don't experience these symptoms for at least 24 hours or the illness is gone. You may want to call your child's doctor if you have any questions about the symptoms. Similarly, if your child is complaining of an earache, it's time to make an appointment for the doctor.

Finally, if your child has a minor sore throat, it's usually not a problem and they're okay to go to school or day care. However, if the sore throat becomes more severe, it could mean that your child has strep throat. Other symptoms of strep throat include headache and an upset stomach. At this point, they should be kept home from school. Be sure to call your doctor to schedule an appointment as there is a special test that can determine whether your child has strep throat. Once your child has taken antibiotic treatment for 24 hours, they are able to return to school.

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Classrooms are breeding grounds for germs. Kids can infect each other over and over again. Remember, if you're unsure whether it's a good idea for your child to go to school when they are complaining about feeling ill, be sure to call your doctor for advice. Lastly, don't forget to wash your hands and your children's hands with soap and water regularly. It is one of the best ways to prevent the spread of infection and illness.
