**Rock County Support of the National Moment of Remembrance
of the 10th Anniversary of September 11th, 2011**

- 1 **WHEREAS**, the Rock County Board of Supervisors expresses their support of the United States
2 Senate regarding coming together as a Nation and ceasing all work or other activity for a moment of
3 remembrance beginning at 12:00 p.m. Central Daylight Time on September 11, 2011, in honor of the
4 10th anniversary of the terrorist attacks committed against the United States on September 11, 2001;
5 and
6
- 7 **WHEREAS**, at 8:46 a.m. on September 11, 2001, hijacked American Airlines Flight 11 crashed into
8 the upper portion of the North Tower of the World Trade Center in New York City, New York.
9 Seventeen minutes later, at 9:03 a.m., hijacked United Airlines Flight 175 crashed into the South
10 Tower of the World Trade Center; and
11
- 12 **WHEREAS**, at 9:37 a.m., the west wall of the Pentagon was hit by hijacked American Airlines Flight
13 77, the impact of which caused immediate and catastrophic damage to the headquarters of the
14 Department of Defense; and
15
- 16 **WHEREAS**, at approximately 10:00 a.m., the passengers and crew of hijacked United Airlines Flight
17 93 acted heroically to retake control of the airplane and thwart the taking of additional American lives
18 by crashing the airliner in Shanksville, Pennsylvania, and, in doing so, gave their lives to save
19 countless others; and
20
- 21 **WHEREAS**, nearly 3,000 innocent civilians were killed in the heinous attacks of September 11, 2001;
22 and tens of thousands of individuals narrowly escaped the attacks at the Pentagon and World Trade
23 Center and, as witnesses to this tragedy, are forever changed; and countless fire departments, police
24 departments, first responders, governmental officials, workers, emergency medical personnel, and
25 volunteers responded immediately and heroically to those horrific events; and
26
- 27 **WHEREAS**, the Fire Department of New York suffered 343 fatalities on September 11, 2001, the
28 largest loss of life of any emergency response agency in United States history; and the Port Authority
29 Police Department suffered 37 fatalities in the attacks, the largest loss of life of any police force in
30 United States history in a single day; and the New York Police Department suffered 23 fatalities as a
31 result of the terrorist attacks; and
32
- 33 **WHEREAS**, the impact of that day on public health continues through 2011, as nearly 90,000 people
34 are at risk of or suffering from negative health effects as a result of the events of September 11,
35 2001, including 14,000 workers and 2,400 community residents who are sick, and tens of thousands
36 of others whose health is being monitored; and
37
- 38 **WHEREAS**, 10 years later, the people of the United States and people around the world continue to
39 mourn the tremendous loss of innocent life on that fateful day; and 10 years later, thousands of men
40 and women in the United States Armed Forces remain in harm's way defending the United States
41 against those who seek to threaten the United States; and
42
- 43 **WHEREAS**, on the 10th anniversary of this tragic day, the thoughts of the people of the United States
44 are with all of the victims of the events of September 11, 2001 and their families; and the lives of
45 Americans were changed forever on September 11, 2001, when events threatened the American way
46 of life; and
47
- 48 **WHEREAS**, in 2009, Congress and the President joined together to designate September 11 as a
49 National Day of Service and Remembrance under the Serve America Act (Public Law 111-13; 123
50 Stat. 1460); and in September 2009 and 2010, President Obama issued Proclamation 8413 (74 Fed.
51 Reg. 47045) and Proclamation 8559 (75 Fed. Reg. 56463) proclaiming September 11, 2009, and

52 September 11, 2010, respectively, as Patriot Day and National Day of Service and Remembrance;
53 and

55 **WHEREAS**, September 11 will never, and should never, be just another day in the hearts and minds
56 of all people of the United States;

57
58 **NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** that the Rock County Board of Supervisors:

59
60 (1) recognizes September 11, 2011, as a day of solemn commemoration of the events of September
61 11, 2001, and a day to come together as a Nation; and

62
63 (2) offers its deepest and most sincere condolences to the families, friends, and loved ones of the
64 innocent victims of the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks; and

65
66 (3) honors the heroic service, actions, and sacrifices of first responders, law enforcement personnel,
67 State and local officials, volunteers, and countless others who aided the innocent victims of those
68 attacks and, in doing so, bravely risked and often gave their own lives; and

69
70 (4) recognizes the valiant service, actions, and sacrifices of United States personnel, including
71 members of the United States Armed Forces, the United States intelligence agencies, the United
72 States diplomatic service, homeland security and law enforcement personnel, and their families, who
73 have given so much, including their lives and well-being, to support the cause of freedom and defend
74 the security of the United States; and

75
76 (5) reaffirms that the people of the United States will never forget the challenges our country endured
77 on and since September 11, 2001, and will work tirelessly to defeat those who attacked the United
78 States; and

79
80 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that on the 10th anniversary of this tragic day in United States history
81 the Rock County Board of Supervisors calls upon all of the people and institutions of the United
82 States to observe a moment of remembrance on September 11, 2011, including (i) media outlets; (ii)
83 houses of worship; (iii) military organizations; (iv) veterans organizations; (v) airlines; (vi) airports; (vii)
84 railroads; (viii) sports teams; (ix) the Federal Government; (x) State and local governments; (xi)
85 police, fire, and other public institutions; (xii) educational institutions; (xiii) businesses; and (xiv) other
86 public and private institutions; and

87
88 **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Rock County Board of Supervisors encourages the
89 observance of the moment of remembrance to last for 1 minute beginning at 12:00 p.m. Central
90 Daylight Time by, to the maximum extent practicable ceasing all work or other activity; and marking
91 the moment in an appropriate manner, including by ringing bells, blowing whistles, or sounding sirens.

TO RECOGNIZE JOHN DALEE

1 **WHEREAS**, John Dalee has served the citizens of Rock County for over thirty-two (32) years
2 as a dedicated and valued employee of Rock County; and,
3

4 **WHEREAS**, Mr. Dalee has spent his entire career dedicated to the Rock County Human
5 Services Department in the Mental Health Division. In the summer of 1978, Mr. Dalee began
6 with the county as part-time help where he floated within the Mental Health Division. He
7 officially began his career on June 29, 1979 as a Nurse's Aide on 4th Floor Geriatric Psych
8 Unit for one year. He then went on to be a Psychiatric Technician for 5 years while
9 completing his Bachelor's degree in Social Work. In addition, he was a Crisis worker for 7
10 years while completing his Masters Degree in Guidance and Counseling. Mr. Dalee was the
11 first Crisis worker for Rock County on the day shift. He spent time getting to know the
12 community and building positive working relationships with the organizations we serve daily.
13 He was instrumental in assisting with the development of the Crisis Unit, which is the hub of
14 our Mental Health Division today. Mr. Dalee completed his requirements for his LPC and
15 LCSW and moved into a position at Beloit Counseling Center for six years where he worked
16 exclusively with CPS cases where they were trying to keep children in their family home or
17 reunify families back together. Mr. Dalee then went to Youth Triage for a little over four
18 years where he did mental health assessments for juvenile offenders and made
19 recommendations to the court for disposition. Mr. Dalee then joined the In Home Treatment
20 Team where the goal was to keep children in the home or in the least restrictive setting
21 possible. Finally, Mr. Dalee has been with Family Crisis for the remainder of his years of
22 service to Rock County where he has worked with children and families. He has worked with
23 them on multiple levels including: parenting skills, psychotherapy, team meetings, IEP
24 meetings, and occasional trips to the dog park. While working in this capacity, Mr. Dalee used
25 his previous years of knowledge and experience to provide quality services to Rock County's
26 most vulnerable, children and their families. Mr. Dalee continued his commitment to grow
27 personally and professionally each day that he served the citizens of Rock County. Mr. Dalee
28 will be retiring from Rock County Department of Human Services on August 4, 2011, and,
29

30 **WHEREAS**, Mr. Dalee has proven himself to be a compassionate, caring, and committed
31 employee, always advocating for his program participants and colleagues; and

33 **WHEREAS**, the Rock County Board of Supervisors, representing the citizens of Rock
34 County, wishes to recognize John Dalee for his achievements and significant contributions to
35 the citizens of Rock County and his lifelong and faithful service.
