Whereas upon the application of eight freeholders residing in said town of Johnstown for the altering of a highway as hereinafter described we, the undersigned supervisors of said town, did on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of March 1872 make out a notice and fix therein a time and place at which we would meet and decide upon such application and did meet on the tenth day of May 1872 at one o'clock in the afternoon of said day at the Town Clerk's office it being the time and place fixed by us in said notice, and having first been satisfied that the notice aforesaid had been duly given five days previous to the time of our said meeting to all the occupants of the land, through which said highway passess and had also been posted up in three public places in said town ten days before the time of our said meeting in the manner required by law, we did then and there proceed to examine personally said highway and did hear all reasons that were offered for or against altering the same, and did decide upon such application and it being our opinion, that the public good will thereby be promoted, did decide to alter said highway as hereinafter described.

Now, thereofee, pursuant to said application, we the said supervisors do hereby order and determine that a highway be, and the same is hereby altered and laid out as follows to wit: that the highway known as the Stone School House Road running North and South on section line dividing Section 20 and 21, 16 and 17 commencing at a point 80 rods North of the Southwest corner of Section 16 and running thence North along said Section line until it intersects said road, the line of said survey is the center of said highway, and the same is laid out of the width of four rods.
