CRIMINAL JUSTICE COORDINATING COUNCIL
Minutes – November 21, 2019

Call to Order. Chair Mattingly called the meeting of the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council to order at 3:02 P.M. in the Courthouse Conference Center on the second floor of the Rock County Courthouse-East.

Committee Members Present: Chair Kelly Mattingly, Chief David Moore, Vicki Brown (alt. for Angela Moore), Steve Howland, Jim Neitzel (alt. for Troy Enger), Chief Deputy Craig Strouse (alt. for Sheriff Troy Knudson), Supervisor Terry Fell, Captain Thomas Stigler (alt. for Chief David Zibolski), Kate Luster, Billy Bob Grahn, Lonnie Brigham, Marc Perry and David O’Leary.

Committee Members Absent: Judge Daniel Dillon, Carol Wickersham and Bill Rankin.

Approval of Agenda. Chair Mattingly said the Drug Treatment Court review will be moved to our February meeting. Mr. Perry moved approval of the agenda with this change, second by Mr. Brigham. ADOPTED.

Approval of Minutes of September 19, 2019 and October 17, 2019. Mr. Brigham moved approval of the minutes of September 19, 2019 and October 17, 2019, second by Mr. Howland. ADOPTED.

OWI Treatment Court Review. Judge Haakenson introduced the OWI Treatment Court team. Judge Haakenson reviewed the “Evaluation of the Rock County Operating While Intoxicated (OWI) Treatment Court Program” by Paul Gregory Ph.D. dated April 2019 with the committee. Judge Haakenson said he attended a judicial training in February 2019. The treatment court team attended a two-day training in March 2019. The program has many successes with a couple areas for improvement which are lack of aftercare support, lack of transportation assistance, location of services and data issues. The team is looking at peer support to assist with aftercare support. They are currently at capacity. One barrier they will have in the near future will be demand will be greater than the resource/funding. They continue to work on the time between arrest and entry into the program. Beginning July 1, 2019, the Department of Corrections started covering the monthly treatment cost for participants. Court is held in Courtroom C on Tuesdays at 3:00 P.M and open to the public.

Update on Rock County Legislative Forum on Opiates. Ms. Pohlman McQuillen said the forum had to be postponed to late winter or early spring. She had a lack of commitment to attend from legislators. Responses from legislators said that Monday nights are the most convenient.

EBDM Update. Ms. Pohlman McQuillen said the PSA stakeholder training on October 24th had a good showing. They are hoping to implement in early 2020. They will be working with CJI on a data project. CJI will present a proposal to the Arnold Ventures next month and we will find out in January if the proposal is accepted.

Ms. Luster, Chief Moore, Ms. Pohlman McQuillen and JPD Officer Klementz provided a presentation last week in Lafayette County on the mental health flag. Mr. O'Leary has been reappointed as the co-chair of the State EBDM committee. The next local EBDM meeting will be in January.

Discussion Regarding Law Enforcement Concerns. Chief Moore said Janesville has seen an increase in incidents involving guns. He said the common theme is there was an issue of conflict before the use of the gun. Janesville's Street Crimes unit is working on problem solving the conflicts before they escalate to this point.

Consideration of Future Areas for CJCC Focus/Action (from current and past meetings).

- Chief Moore would like to track school violence
- Mr. Brigham would like a presentation on Restorative Justice (Judge Mitchell will present at our January meeting)
- EBDM presentation on Risk Assessment
- Mr. Perry would like to speak with Homeless liaisons in Beloit and Janesville to get an update on unaccompanied youth population
- Ms. Wickersham would like a conversation on AODA/Mental Health services in the Rock County jail and wrap around services in the community. Mr. Brigham would like to extend this to Rock County youth.
- Safe Families presentation
- Mr. Perry said there have been several studies that name Wisconsin as the most segregated state. He would like to have a conversation around solutions to this issue. He will forward the links to these studies for Ms. Pohlman McQuillen to distribute.
- Mr. Brigham would like to know the percentage of juvenile citations in schools and how this is working.
- Mr. Brigham would like a presentation on bullying in schools and carryover outside of school (at risk youth behavioral data)

Citizen Participation and Announcements. Ms. Pohlman McQuillen said they are making progress on the disorderly conduct data. They will be talking to the individual agencies soon.

Mr. O'Leary explained the recent recall of Arrest Warrant Commitments by the Rock County Judges.
